CAcert with high user gain and new server

The NSA scandal shows: Secure communication on the internet is highly important for many! CAcert has nowadays a high number of new user registrations: In 2013 we had about 27.500 new registrations and all year long a much higher number of new members than in the years before. Now in the first months of this year, we find even 100 new registrations approx. per day.

This is the highest count of new members since founding of CAcert and shows impressively that people desire secure communication and trust CAcert as an independent certificate authority.

CAcert offers its services for free, because we believe that security must be available charge-free. To be able to deliver our services quick, especially the highly demanded ones like wiki, blog and translation system amongst others, the german server hardware supplier Thomas Krenn has donated us a new server as part of their open source sponsorship. This server is now in place and ready to deliver the demands of our users.

The aim of CAcert is to offer free digital certificates that meet the X.509 standard. These digital certificates can be used to sign and encrypt documents as well as to establish secure data communication links.

The CAcert project has 270,000 registered users. [1]
